Exemption from provisions of Health and Safety at Work (Hazardous Substances) Regulations 2017

In accordance with section 220 of the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 (the Act), I, Phil Parkes, Chief Executive at WorkSafe New Zealand, exempt Lanocorp New Zealand Limited from compliance with regulation 10.28(2) and (4) of the Health and Safety at Work (Hazardous Substances) Regulations 2017 (the HS Regulations) for the storage of class 4.2C activated charcoal powders at 2 Hynds Drive Rolleston, Christchurch ('the site').


I do so being satisfied that the extent of the exemption is not broader than is reasonably necessary to address the matters that gave rise to the proposed exemption, and that the exemption is not inconsistent with the purpose of the Act; and subject to the following conditions—

Lanocorp New Zealand Limited must –

- (1) ensure the storage of class 4.2C activated charcoal powders substances complies with Section 5.7 of AS/NZS 5026:2012 *The storage and handling of Class 4 dangerous goods*; and
- (2) ensure no greater than 200 kilograms of class 4.2C activated charcoal powders are stored in the cabinet; and
- (3) ensure no other hazardous substances are stored in the cabinet; and
- (4) provide a copy of this exemption to any compliance certifier engaged to issue a location compliance certificate; and
- (5) hold a copy of this exemption at the site.

This exemption takes effect on 12 November 2021 and expires on 12 November 2026 unless it is replaced sooner or revoked. This exemption is given the reference HS2103.
