#: Agenda was tabled, venue housekeeping and emergency procedures outlined

#: Chair welcomed all attending. Dr Chris Sames will present later on the findings of his study on Occupational Diving lung function and hearing medical tests. DHMS would like to consider these for review in the 1st quarter of 2019. Chair noted that there still appears to be a lack of awareness of the NZ occ diving medical system in some places. A discussion was had on Medicals and diving (and snorkelling) fatalities. Chair noted that Queensland Government ended up regulating recreational sector due to numbers if injuries.

WorkSafe alerted DIAG to incoming guidance on Snorkelling & Breath-hold diving. Chair indicated medications and fitness relevant to this sector. Recommended that snorkelling & breath-hold diving medicals be part of regulations or guidance.

Requested that at further meetings 1 hour be allocated to different sector representatives to outline status and factors affecting industry. Bruce Adams (NZ Police) was asked to present at next meeting on last year's fatalities and, though mainly recreational, whether there are any factors relevant to the occupational sector. Mark Preece (Aquaculture) asked to consider being next.

#: CoCs for Construction Diver Supervisors. DIAG confirmed importance to allow older or medically unfit divers to stay in industry.

- Supervisor medical requirements may be more cognitive need to consider medicals in Supervisor system.
- Sectors have specific requirements and Supervisor competencies.
- ADAS & SubSea allowing a non-diving Supervisor for NZ. WorkSafe to discuss further.
- WorkSafe to investigate if Supervisor CoCs can be added to Guidelines requirements &/or Regulations

#: Dive Supervisors – incorporate them into Guidelines as "Good Practice".

#: Conditional Medical Clearances – DIAG in agreement. WorkSafe to implement when wording agreed with DHMS.

#: Health Based Diving Standards - Awaiting DRAFT from Guidance and Education for discussion with DHMS.

#: Continuing Professional Development for CoCs – WorkSafe to co-develop with DIAG.

#: Waiver for on-site chamber Update. WorkSafe formal response outstanding. Applicant to undertake a full practice of evacuation by helicopter to chamber with diver with simulated DCS.

#: Offsite Evacuation Plans – included in DRAFT Guidelines, awaiting circulation.

#: SSBA Part 3 Currency & CoC Renewal requirements - Worksafe to suggest wording. Mike (SubSea) to circulate ADAS Competency Refresher Program

#: SF17 Standards Committee – currently appears that there was no sign of agreement within the science diving group. Awaiting outcome of 2299.2 and 2815.6 DRAFTS.

#: WorkSafe Guidelines Review Project update – awaiting Guidance and Education to release DRAFT to DIAG and Working Group

#: DRAFT Risk Model for Occupational Diving – WorkSafe to Update and circulate to outline different job levels for risk profiles

#: Minimum requirements for Standby Divers – Mike (SubSea) & WorkSafe to discuss and circulate Draft wording to members

#: Possible DRAFT Snorkelling Safety Alert discussed. WorkSafe outlined recent event where educational snorkelling program resulted in leader/assistant suffering medical issue, sinking underwater and needing rescue & recovery. DRAFT Wording to be circulated to DIAG for input.

#: Film & Media CoC discussed

- Dave (Liquid Action Films) outlined difference between Cinematography & Photography and between different roles on film sets (safety diver, stunt diver, production crew). Various levels to be included within Risk Model.
- WorkSafe outlined that camera use for construction surveys and recreational teaching & guiding and own images were not part of Film & Photographic sector and therefore did not need an F&P CoC. Clarification needed to include amateur use and casual publication
- F&P CoCs to include a letter from industry (as is done in Science).

#: Member Elections – Elections discussion deferred to end 2019 unless requested by Sector.

#: Next Meeting to be held in Wellington in April.

#: General discussion – No additional matters were raised.

#: Invited Presentation from Dr Chris Sames - Lung Function & Hearing tests for the Occupational Diving Medical. DIAG discussed study findings & proposed changes to medical system. DIAG supports recommendations to remove hearing & lung function tests from on-going occupational

diving medicals (but retain them for initial tests and where indicated by diver health). DIAG thanked Dr Sames for his presentation.
