Public notice relating to material proposed to be incorporated by reference in proposed hazardous substances safe work instrument

In accordance with clause 1(a) of Schedule 2 of the Legislation Act 2019, I, Kane Patena, Interim Chief Executive, WorkSafe New Zealand (WorkSafe), give notice of a proposal to incorporate the standards listed in the table below into a proposed safe work instrument for the purposes of Regulation 17.67(5)(j) of the Health and Safety at Work (Hazardous Substances) Regulations 2017.

The proposal is to set requirements for burners by specifying five standards for burners used for the combustion of:

- class 3.1 substances (categories 1–4 flammable liquids), or
- a hazardous substance approved by the Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) for use as a fuel for a burner.

This would enable WorkSafe to approve types of burners that comply with those standards.

The table below sets out which standards are proposed for incorporation and the internet site addresses where the standards can be purchased.
